## Agenda items

- Nate Auwerda welcomed everyone. Review of agenda. Motion to approve by Hannah Dolata. Samantha Walters seconded the motion. Agenda was approved.
- Reviewed October & November meeting minutes. Stephanie Richter motioned to approve the minutes from October and November. Monica Diaz-Perng seconded the motion. Minutes were approved.
- From the Superintendent the minutes from our SCC meetings need to be posted 24 hours after the meeting. Hannah Dolata will look at adjusting the link for access to post minutes.
- SCC Amendment was presented by Hannah Dolata for software purchases. McMillan had some software needs arise for ISL (sp?) and Digital vocabulary to assist teachers with hybrid and online students. The vote was to move \$5,300.00 from the technology budget to the software budget. We had 6 For the amendment, 0 Against the amendment and 1 Council member absent.
- Hannah Dolata gave an update on purchasing science kits for McMillan. There is an ebook FOSS kit that can be purchased and provides the teaching assistance and information the teachers need. This option is less expensive and if it works could save money. They are now working through that option and will provide an update once they work through it.
- Hannah Dolata gave an update on Reading Literacy at McMillan. The results are positive. They have had a number of students move from red/yellow to blue/green on their Diebel's testing. McMillan's numbers showed great growth compared to other schools in the Murray School District. There are still things

that need to be done but financially she feels they are right on track with the budget for reading assistance.

- The Land & Trust website is currently down. The website is delayed six weeks and are hoping to have it up and running on April 19, 2021.
- Vaccinations for Covid-19 are under way. Murray will receive 3% of the allotted supply. Murray School District will be rolling out vaccine options from oldest to youngest to get the supply out quickly. Participants will have 24 hours to sign up and reserve their vaccine.
- A motion was made by Monica Diaz-Perng to adjourn the meeting and Samantha Walters seconded the motion.
