Staffing Plan Discussed shifting an FTE to a 5th grade position for 24-25, using FT classroom aides to support K-2 because of the following: high needs population (behavior and academics) in the 23-24 school year. Andrea shared that these students have a history of impacted education due to Covid experiences Joe shared that 5th grade is critical for wrapping up the elementary standards before they shift to secondary in the sixth grade. Hailey shared that there is a more significant need for students receiving SPED services in this grade level than in others as well. We briefly discussed using an FTE for a split classroom, but Rebecca Elder shared that in the past, the upper grades have voted for larger classes rather than have splits because they are so difficult and the outcomes are not certain. Hannah shared that split grade level classrooms are used in the magnet program, but that they are too difficult for most students to thrive in.
